3. Call for nominations "Danubius Young Scientist Award 2018"

The "Danubius Young Scientist Award" will be granted to 14 young scientists - one in each country that is part of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region [Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Romania and Ukraine].

The award seeks to highlight the scientific work and talent of young researchers and enhance the visibility of the scientific community in the region: Moreover the award encourages young scientists to engage themselves in the scientific examination of the multifaceted issues and questions specifically related to the Danube Region.

The award will be **endowed with 1.200 EUR for each winner** of the young scientist award.

AWARD Criteria

Scientific excellence and innovative approach of the academic work

Thematic relevance of the scientific work for issues/problems of the Danube Region

Relevance of the scientific work beyond the national borders

Potential of the candidate (for example: integration in international networks, participation in scientific projects, publication history, experience in teaching, etc.)

No formal age limit - BUT

Limitation to participants that have received their master/PhD max. 5 years ago (= after 1st of January 2013). Submissions of candidates holding only a bachelor degree will not be accepted.

DOCUMENT SUBMISSION:

Documents have to be submitted in **English language** (exception: copy of the academic title received) and have to consist of the following parts:

- A. Max. 3 pages summary of the scientific work (e.g. thesis, dissertation, journal article, scientific publication, etc.)
- B. 1/2 page statement explaining the relevance of the work for the Danube Region and as appropriate the relevance beyond national borders
- C. Curriculum vitae including publication list of the candidate (max. 3 pages)
- D. Copy of the document related to the award of the highest academic title received (to verify the criteria of max. 5 years after master degree or PhD degree).

SELECTION PROCESS:

Candidates for the "Danubius Young Scientist Award" can come from all scientific disciplines.

The nomination of the award candidate cannot be made by the <u>candidate</u> himself/herself but he or she <u>has to be nominated by their hosting scientific organization</u> (university, academy of sciences, etc.).

The <u>number of nominations per organization is limited to 3</u>.

Every university, academy of sciences or research organization etc. can nominate up to a maximum of three candidates in total; however the three candidates have to come from different faculties or departments, institutes or research groups within the organization.

An <u>international expert jury will be established</u> that will be responsible for assessing all incoming nominations and for determining a final ranking list.

The <u>highest ranked candidate from each of the countries of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region will be recommended for the award</u>.

The School is part of the Danube:Future project, a joint initiative of the Alps-Adriatic Rectors' Conference and the Danube Rectors' Conference, which has been endorsed as flagship project of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region, priority area 7 - Knowledge Society.

The School deals with "Project Management and Entrepreneurship for Sustainable Development of the Regions in the Danube River Basin". In the enclosed Call for applications you will find an overview of the programme and requirements for participants.

We invite applications by **PhD Students** and **Junior Post-docs** of your University, especially those with experience and interest in interdisciplinary studies in the context of sustainable development. We would be happy if you could promote the Call at your University as a unique opportunity to learn and interact in interdisciplinary groups with a high-level faculty.

<u>The participation is free</u>. All organizational costs and participants' living expenses (food allowance and accommodation) shall be covered by the Danube-University Krems and its sponsors, i.e. the Central European Initiative; as a contribution of your institution, we hope you will be able to cover travel costs fully or partly (in the latter case the rest has to be borne by the participant).

The European Commission is organising next 4th and 5th July 2018 the workshop: 'Investment Readiness of Innovation Projects in South East Europe' in Zagreb, Croatia

This workshop will explore the support mechanisms required for innovations to grow and scale up in South Eastern Europe, while connecting the macro-level perspective of government and policy makers with hands-on insights from innovators and enablers.

Objectives

The main focus of this workshop is to exchange best practices in supporting investment readiness for technology-based scale-ups and start-ups in South East Europe and the Western Balkans and understand the requirements for developing bankable projects. Policy initiatives, implementation processes, instruments and capacity building activities will be presented, as well as first-hand experiences and case studies from across the region and beyond.

The conclusions of this event are expected to feed into broader political developments, and contribute to existing and new tailor-made instruments that can wider support innovative companies in the area.

Location and co-organisers

Zagreb has been selected to host this workshop and showcase their innovation and technology transfer ecosystem within South East Europe. The event will take place at the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Naval Architecture of the University of Zagreb, which is the oldest and biggest faculty of this field in Croatia.

This two day workshop envisages bringing together innovation practitioners and decision-makers with an interest in supporting scale-ups and start-ups, and regional stakeholders from EU member states, enlargement and neighbourhood countries in South East Europe.

The number of attendees is estimated at around 100-120, and selected participants from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo*, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Ukraine, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Turkey may be eligible for reimbursement of their travel and accommodation expenses.

Attendance to the event is by invitation only. If you wish to participate you are encouraged to submit an <u>expression of interest</u> (**deadline 08/06/2018**). More details on programme can be found <u>here</u>.

Given the limited number of places, we will not be able to admit all interested applicants but will perform a selection based on applicant's background, affiliation and motivation with due respect to a fair geographical representation.
