CALL FOR PAPERS

Thematic issue of the regional journal "Der Donauraum": From Fictional to Functioning Democracy. Developing Concepts and Strategies for an Inclusive and Participatory Europe

Submission Deadline: May 31, 2020 Language: English

Liberal democracy appears to be at risk – both in Europe and abroad. New forms of **populist democracies** spread, framed by biased political communication through ideological misinformation, hate speech and tribalism. Authoritarian politicians try to turn Europe into an arena, where metaphorically speaking leaders of tribes are fighting each other by any tools to cement their own positions. In parallel with the **rise of xenophobia, populism and radicalisation**, liberal democratic principles such as checks and balances are gradually eroding. Moreover, the lack of a common public sphere is challenging European integration processes. **Decreasing press freedom** and **increasing mistrust in traditional media** pave the way for populists that rely on oligarchic media networks and use the effects of so-called 'filter bubbles' and 'echo chambers' on social media. Biased (social) media thus creates but a mere **individual fiction**, the façade of a homogeneous world corresponding to the viewers' perceptions.

As part of the <u>Jean Monnet Project titled "From Fictional to Functioning Democracy (FIFUDEM)</u>", carried out by the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM) and Danube Rectors' Conference (DRC), the thematic issue of the journal "Der Donauraum" brings up the **problem of fictional democracy** - a new form of façade democracy that produces illiberal fictions of democracy. With this publication, the editors Dr. Erhard Busek and Dr. Silvia Nadjivan aim to collect practical visions and scientific approaches for actively committed citizenship in a functioning democracy, embedded in a common and inclusive European Union. Below we present a list of potential (not limited) topics for the thematic issue:

- Use of Education for Democratic Participation
- Ways of Political Responsibility for Functioning Democracy
- Concepts for Interrelations of Civic Engagement and Liberal Democracy
- New Democratic Forms of (Social) Media Communication

With this Call for Papers we are seeking both **junior and senior scholars and practitioners** from various disciplines who would like to present their research results on this topic in the upcoming issue. In addition to invited authors, including the panelists of the projects' kick-off conference in January 2020, Vienna, the editors particularly encourage authors from Central East and South East Europe to complement the conference proceedings with their perspectives and ideas.

2. CALL FOR NOMINATIONS | DANUBIUS YOUNG SCIENTIST AWARD

Background

The Danubius Award was created in 2011 by the Austrian Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Research (BMBFW) and the Institute for the Danube Region and Central Europe (IDM) with the intention to honor persons with extraordinary achievements in their scientific activity and output in relation to the Danube Region. The Award In 2020, this award will be complemented for the seventh time, with a specific price for young scientists – the "Danubius Young Scientist Award". This award will be granted to **14 young scientists** - one in each country that is part of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region [Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Romania and the Ukraine]. The award seeks to highlight the scientific work and talent of young researchers and enhance the visibility of the scientific community in the region: Moreover, the award encourages young scientists to engage in the scientific examination of the multifaceted issues and questions specifically related to the Danube Region.

The award will be endowed with 1,200 Euros for each winner of the Danubius Young Scientist Award.

AWARD Criteria

- · Scientific excellence and innovative approach of the academic work
- Thematic relevance of the scientific work for issues/problems of the Danube region
- Relevance of the scientific work beyond the national borders
- Potential of the candidate (for example: integration in international networks, participation in scientific projects, publication history, experience in teaching etc.)
- No formal age limit BUT Limitation to participants that have received their Master/PhD max. 5 years ago (= after 1st of January 2015)
- · Submissions of candidates holding only a bachelor degree will not be accepted

This call for proposals, launched by the <u>TESI Local Programme Committee</u>, aims to collect ideas and to support the development of initiatives which will enhance dissemination, education, networking and training from now until ESOF 2020.

In particular the call collects and evaluates three distinct groups of initiatives:

- proESOF events 2018-2020 preferentially in the North-East of Italy and Central and Eastern European areas;
- Science in the City Festival, Trieste ESOF 2020 (three weeks from June 27 to July 18, 2020)
- Draft proposals for the official call of ESOF 2020 Trieste (Call in January 2019).

The proposals may be related to the following areas:

Science to Science: focused on current and future path-breaking science, it provides for keynote speeches and events, plenary sessions, workshops, rountables and debates. It encompasses social sciences and humanities as well as physical and life sciences, engineering and medicine.

Science to Business: a unique platform in Europe to exchange ideas and good practices on research-driven business

models, public private partnerships, the economic developments resulting from technological innovation, future careers and future "new jobs" opportunities.

Science to Policy: stakeholders, governments, scientists, industry and the public in the Triveneto region and in the South East European countries, will be asked to cooperate in a joint effort to ensure reliable, evidence-based policy-making for the benefit of the society as a whole. Possible discussion subjects include the ethical use of scientific knowledge in addressing the grand challenges of humankind, integrity of science, science diplomacy to build peace and cohesion.

Science to Citizens: it aims to create a scientific citizenship for all and to promote the idea of science as fundamental to problem-solving. All activities and events organized in this frame will inspire passion and a collaborative attitude in people, from the very young to the elderly, in order to build a sense of identity and ownership within the field of science.

Science to Communicators: aimed at building a solid network of science communicators active in different fields (from journalism to events organizing, from publishing to communication corporate) across Europe, with a special focus on the Triveneto region and the South East European countries.

Also in 2020, the DRC is funding one residence scholarship that enables the scholarship holder to pursue his/ her artistic work within one month in the summer of 2020 at the **Canetti House in Ruse, Bulgaria**.

The Canetti Artist Scholarship is aimed at artists from all over Europe. The fact that it is also advertised to artists from neighboring countries - from the Western Balkans and Turkey, should in particular provide opportunities for international, artistic exchange. Various different forms of arts should be fostered by the scholarship: painters, photographers, writers, performance artists, translators and musicians can apply for it. The slogan of the scholarship "Sharing Future" aims at a collaborative creation and cooperation for a joint Europe and a common future.

The scholarship is advertised for one month a year.

The scholarship holder can

- pursue his/ her artistic work undisturbed in the spring / summer of 2020 in Ruse
- use the historic Canetti house as work place with various possibilities for artistic expression using the space (photos attached)
- get to know the local cultural scene in Ruse and Bulgaria and use the resulting synergies and artistic realization
- live in an apartment provided by the IECS
- receive 1200 € for contribution and 300 for € travel expenses or 1500 € for both combined

- artist curriculum vitae
- · significant illustrations of the artistic works in personal catalogs or a portfolio
- brief outline of the planned project
