4. JRC | New call for Open Access to the JRC Nanobiotechnology Laboratory



We are glad to announce the **launch of a call** to access the Nanobiotechnology <u>Laboratory</u> at the Joint Research Centre (JRC) of the European Commission in <u>Ispra</u>.



The JRC facilitates the access to the Nanobiotechnology Laboratory by waiving the access costs and in particular by providing travel and subsistence to users visiting the JRC from institutions from <u>countries eligible</u> for the <u>Spreading Excellence and</u> <u>Widening Participation Action</u>.

The <u>Nanobiotechnology Laboratory</u> features state-of-the-art equipped facilities designed to foster interdisciplinary studies. A special emphasis lies on characterisation of nanomaterials, micro(nano)plastics, nanomedicines, advanced materials and their interactions with biological systems, as well as on the detection, identification and characterisation of nanomaterials in food and consumer products.



Priority topics of the call:

- Nanomaterial characterisation including their interactions with biological systems (culture media, proteins, etc.)
- Detection of nanomaterials and nano(micro)plastics in complex matrices



- Surface chemical analysis of macro and nanomaterials. Surface modification and nano-fabrication
- Biomolecular interaction studies, characterisation of antibodies and antigens, bio-interfaces characterisation
- Advanced material characterisation for non-bio-applications (energy, transport, circular economy, environment etc.).

5. EUA Open Science Survey



We would like to inform you that the deadline for submitting your institution's views and experiences on Open Science through the **EUA Open Science Survey** has been extended until **15 January 2021**. It is essential for EUA to be able to develop evidence-based policies, to effectively advocate for adequate conditions and policies




at European and national levels and to support member institutions in the transition to Open Science. Gathering a large and representative number of responses to this survey is therefore critical for EUA's voice on Open Science to reflect the situation and needs across the broad membership of the Association

We therefore invite your institution to take part in the EUA Open Science Survey, if you have not already done so. Your contribution is essential to support capacitybuilding activities for EUA members and to strengthen the voice of universities in European policy making.

6. COVID-19 Measures at the Universities



We are recovering from difficult times we experienced in the past months. Although the intensity of COVID-19 is waning in Europe, we need to learn from our experiences and be prepared for potential second wave of the virus.

The introduction of different forms of **distance learning** was an unprecedented and in many ways challenging situation for most universities in the region. In order to use the gained experiences efficiently we need to exchange the lessons learned regarding the distance learning.

Therefore, we decided to explore how university associations such as DRC could contribute to alleviating the impact of government measures on universities, whereas **our focus primarily refered to various forms of the distance learning (E-learning)**. The collected information on the possibilities of the distance contact could consequently also be used during our DRC Annual conference taking place in November this year.

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8. EUA online Thematic Workshop




The **EUA-CDE Thematic Workshop** will take place online on 21-22 January 2021 and it will gather more than 260 universities to discuss emerging issues related to digitalisation in the framework of doctoral education.

Nowadays, digitalisation plays an important role within education, artificial intelligence and other forms of data-driven research have increasingly been the focus of discussions as they provide new and unexpected opportunities, but also raise questions related to the risks attached to the development of such new technologies. This workshop will focus on the role of doctoral education in the context of these rapid technological and conceptual changes, how doctoral schools are influenced and how they can make efficient use of emerging digital technologies. It will discuss the training and skills needs of doctoral candidates and provide a forum for an exchange of reflections and good practices.

The workshop's programme is divided into two main parts. It combines two webinars open to anyone with an interest in doctoral education and several online sessions reserved to EUA-CDE members only.






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We are continuously strengthening and expanding our network. Since November 2015, the DRC is affiliate member of the European University Association.
